What does it mean to be *Rural*?

Webster's New World Dictionary (Third College Edition) defines "rural" as "of or characteristic of the country, country life, or country people; rustic", also, "living in the country", and "having to do with farming; agricultural". The derivation of the word has its root in the Latin *rus* (gen. *ruris*), meaning "the country" and in the Indo-European base *rewos*, meaning "to open, Room".



What does it mean to be *Rural*?

The meaning of “rural” conveys physical and visual attributes such as working farms, with large tracts of open, undeveloped land, and retaining a mostly open appearance. The viewscape is protected, with **a landscape dominated by farm fields, open pasture and cropland, scenic mountains and ridges, and large tracts of woodland** with a diversity of native and natural vegetation. Large tracts of undeveloped land remain available for rural recreation. **Residential development does not dominate the landscape**, nor is the primary or principal pattern of land use: there is a lack of congestion, “country roads” are adequate, with **clean air, clean rivers and streams, clean edges to villages and towns,** and dark skies. **Suburban development patterns are not present**, but rather, low density residential development persists, enabling continued agricultural activity. **Historic sites and landmarks are preserved. Service areas, with public water and sewer available, are compact yet retaining the small town atmosphere** and confined to designated growth areas, in and around the existing towns, and where cooperative planning between the towns and county ensures the preservation of open space in the unincorporated areas. Local businesses and commercial development are in balance with the community. Taxation policy promotes agriculture and open space.

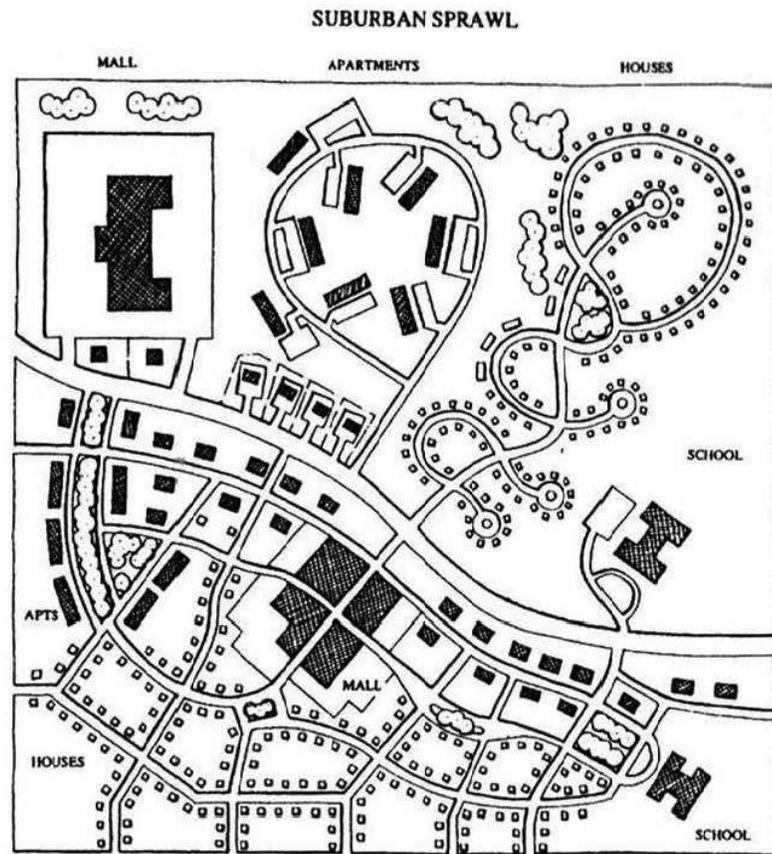

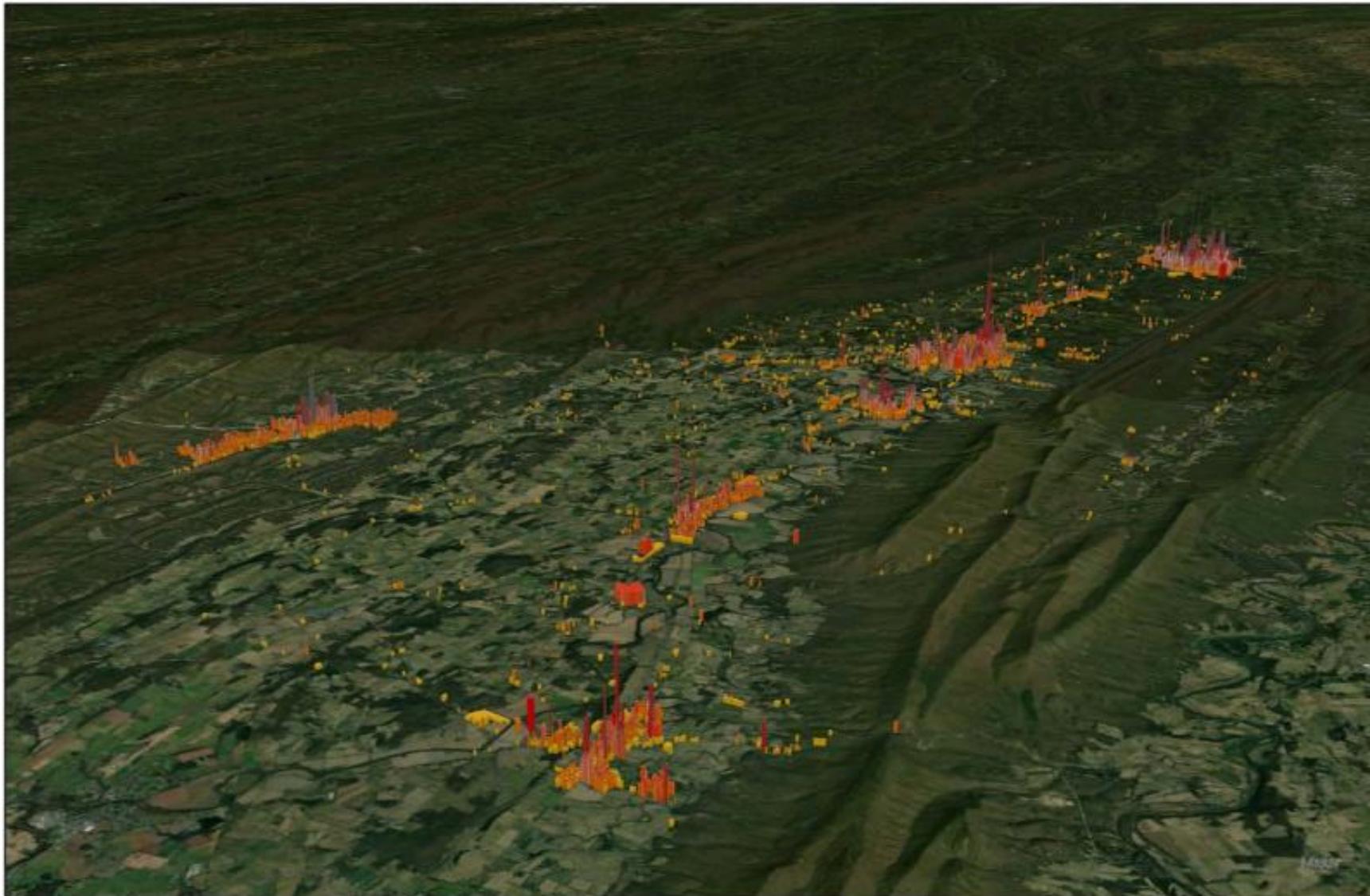

Results

- Data on each chapter reveals the following statements:
 1. Historic resources and sites such as the battlefield and buildings should be protected.
 2. Development of any kind should not disrupt farmland and the rural character should be protected.
 3. We should support the growth of new and existing small businesses for a local economy.
 4. Housing should be affordable in a variety of types such as apartments, shared housing and senior living.
 5. We should increase river, trail, and park access as well as support new restaurants and invest in our schools.
 6. Transportation investments should improve safety and access for all methods, and ShenGO is a great asset.

Results

- In addition to the chapters we heard the following statements on future projects:
 - River and creek access should be improved for all, including ADA, along with water quality.
 - Major community facilities serving the entire County should be centrally located.
 - There is little to no support or opposition for Corridor H being built in Shenandoah County.
 - Development should occur in the Towns, where people already live and resources already exist.
 - A new school should be built before 2045, there is concern on the current elementary school sizes.
 - Alternate routes from Rt 11/I-81 in the event of wrecks or major events on Rt 11 and I-81 should be clear.
 - Towns and villages should capitalize on the rail trail with amenities and business opportunities.
 - There should be a unified effort to connect, expand, and improve recreational amenities through the County

Results

- At the Walking Tours there were common themes of why downtown is so successful:
 1. Human scale buildings and facades with matching characteristics and a sense of enclosure on the street.
 2. Mix of private and public space as well as a mix of uses and times of day/week so people are always there.
 3. Downtown is valuable such as being a tax asset, encourage and promote infill and art where appropriate.

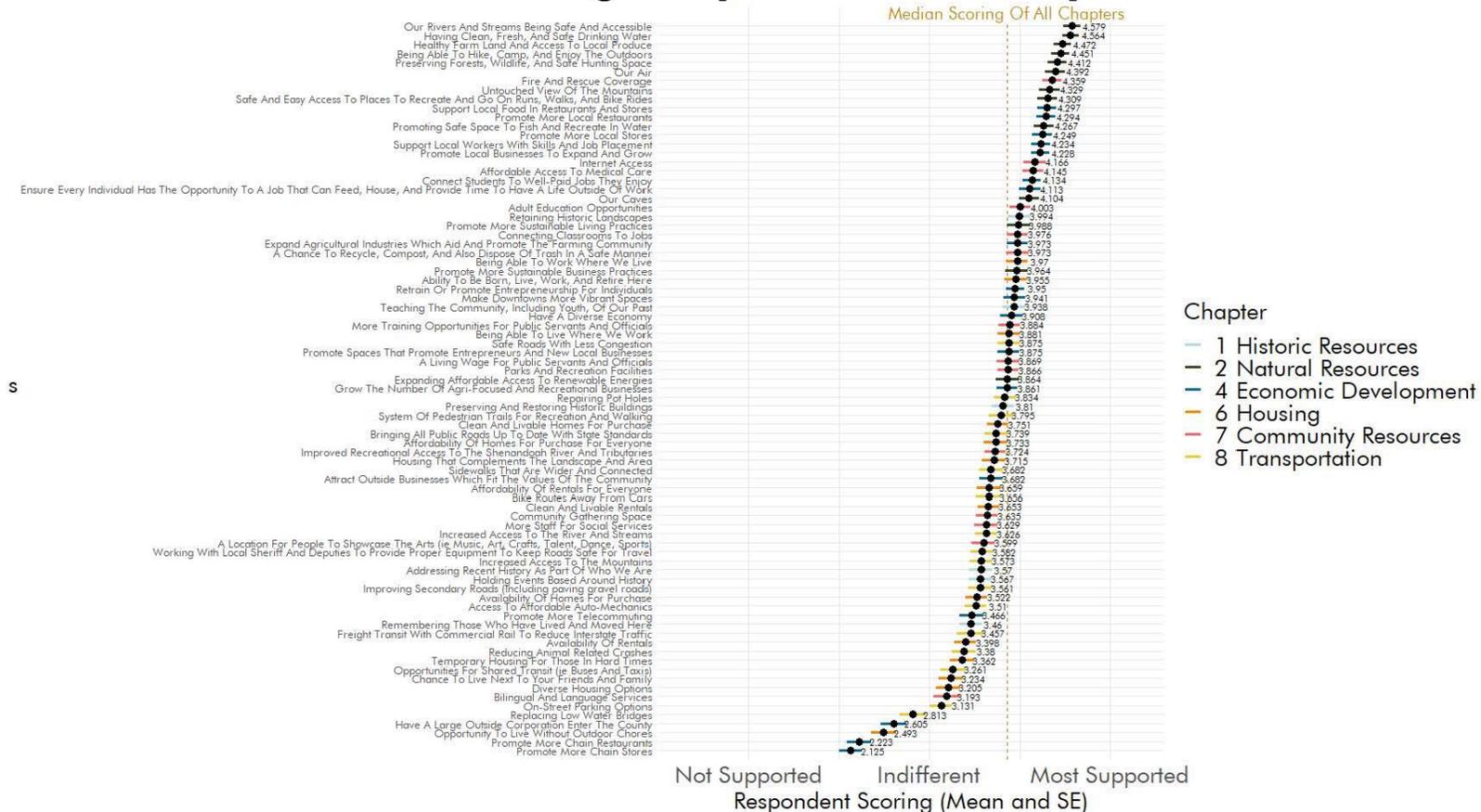

CHAPTER RESULTS OVERVIEW

We took all of the responses that participants provided us from all of the Chapter-based questions and sorted them based on the average rating of all ratings provided. We also color coded the responses by Chapter as can be seen on the right hand side. We also took the median of all of these aspects and drew a line which shows half of all responses above or right of the line and half below or left of the line. This line is also on every Chapter bar chart so its easier to clearly see which items where in the top half of ideas and which were in the bottom half. Further, if an item is to the right of Indifferent then the public overall supports it, while if its to the left the public overall does not support it.

Here are some of the statements that respondents provided us per District:

District 1 Ideas

- The Valley that grew but still preserved the beauty.
- Full towns, surrounded by farms
- Open landscape and be able to point out places in the community to my kids

District 2 Ideas

- Rural space with communities, rather than suburban sprawl

- Clean, well organized towns dotting an otherwise rural landscape. Solar and wind farms distributed throughout valley.

- Beautiful, rural area with most growth clustered around towns, some industrial growth on or near already-existing sites

- Clear skies & beautification & vegetation & well kept landscaping & buildings!!
- The Seven Bends, farming, clear skies, small industry
- Purposeful advancement and NEW SCHOOL BUILDINGS!!!!!!

District 5 Ideas

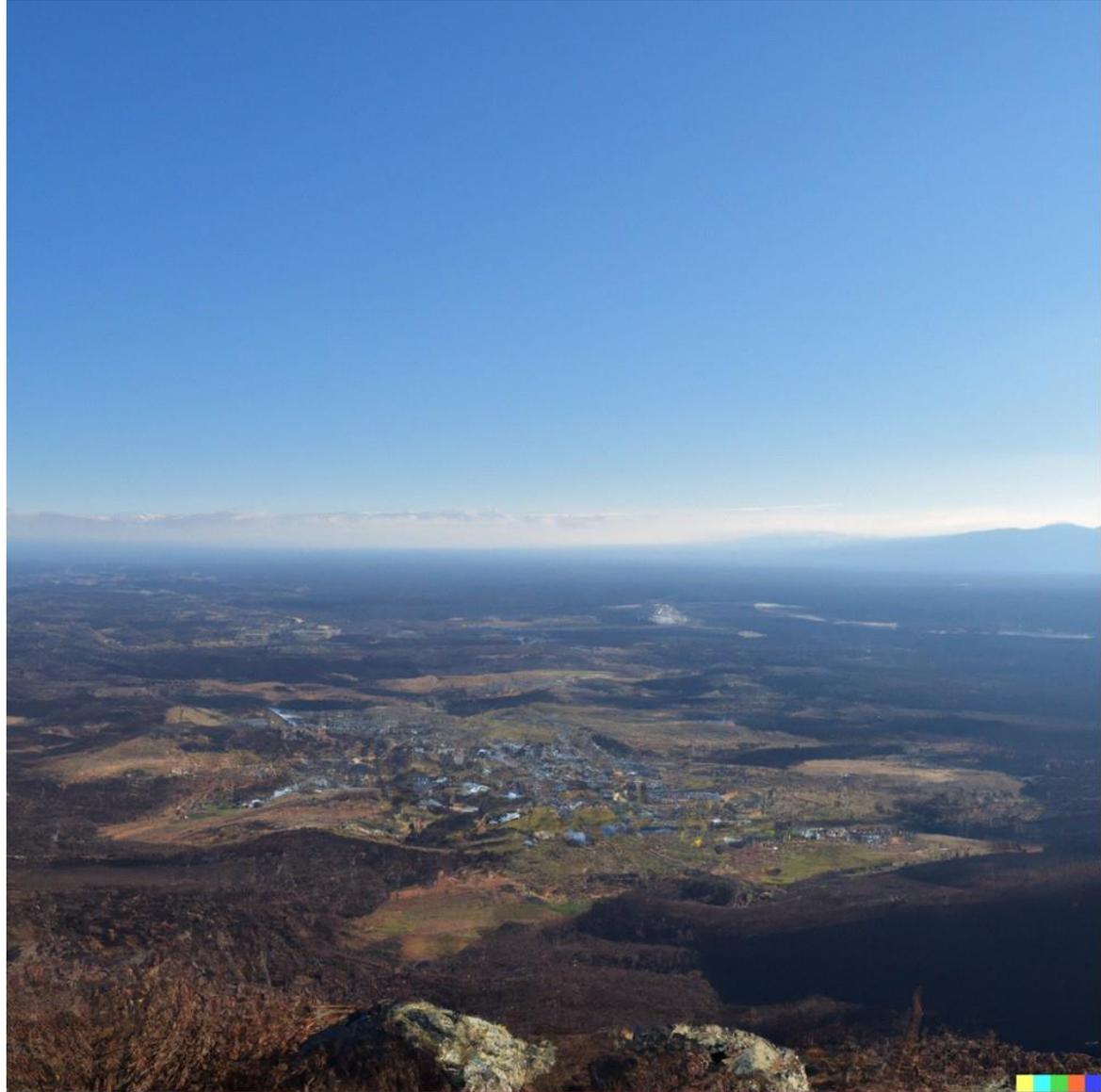
- Green, open spaces, farmland, and small towns

District 1 Ideas

- More stores, not just for tourists, the well to do or retired
- Full sidewalks, outdoor seating, lush landscaping
- People smiling, walking, eating, talking, relaxing, and social

District 2 Ideas

- Mixed use zoning, with town centers and residential mixed
- A vibrant downtown with something besides thrift stores
- A vibrant, diverse community free of the Stars and Bars
- Parks, community events, remit of historical buildings more local businesses

District 3 Ideas

- Walkable access to stores, restaurants. Performing arts center(s)
- People, safe walking and biking paths to schools, stores and recreation, and local merchants.
- Mom and pop restaurants, shops featuring the local talents
- All the buildings on route 11 restored to a decent standard!!!

District 4 Ideas

- People enjoying time outside, shopping, eateries, and entertainment
- Clean streets, uncluttered yards, no vacant buildings
- No homeless people, businesses that were open and thriving, not too much noise, good air quality, a diverse community
- Walkable, tree shaded sidewalks; bike paths; thriving local businesses

District 5 Ideas

- Diverse, small shops locally owned, e.g., coffee & pastry shop, flower shop, book store and/or library, small diner or restaurant

- People out enjoying local shops, eateries, and learning spaces
- Colorful vibrant buildings, people walking, patios, laughter, smiles, lots of trees.
- Buildings being used not run down and dilapidated

To The Street

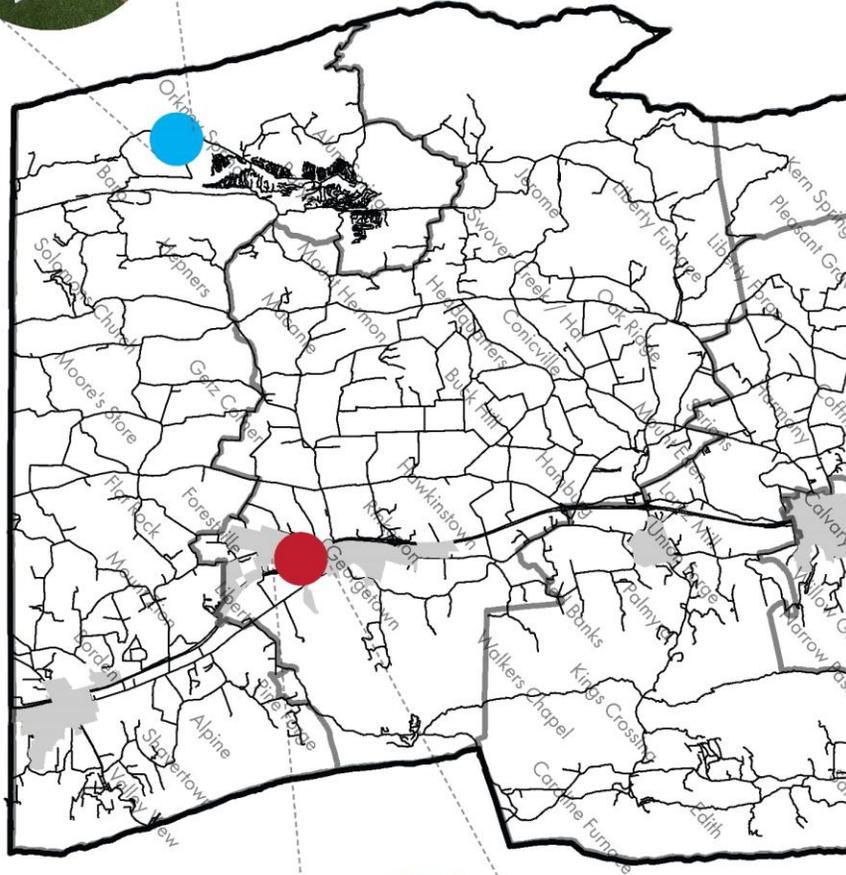

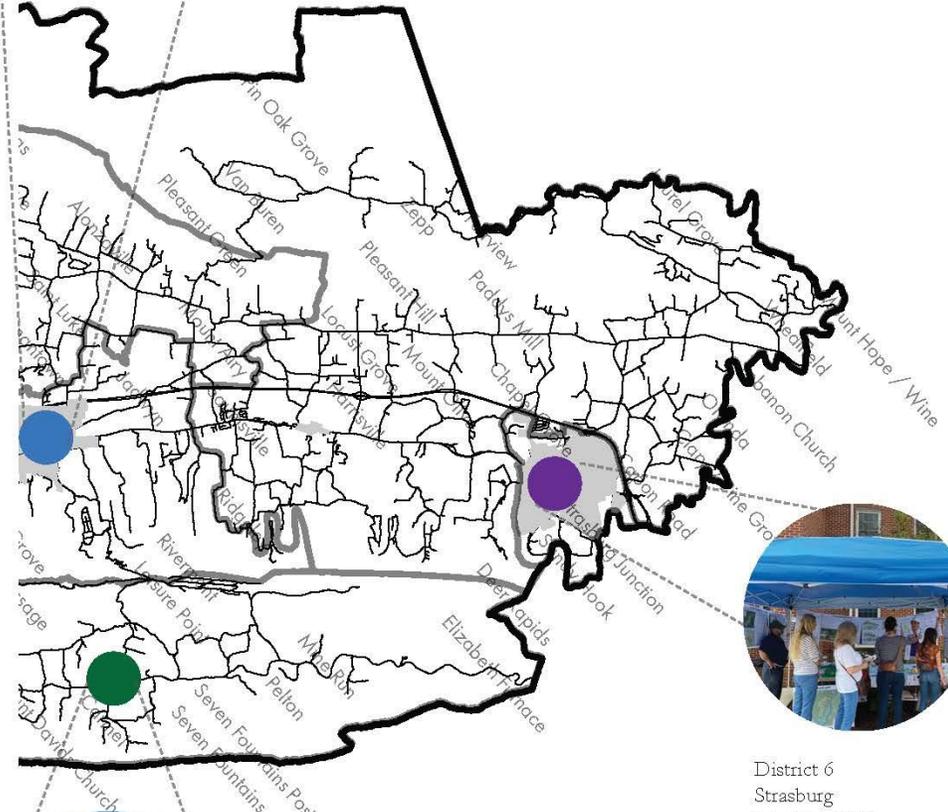

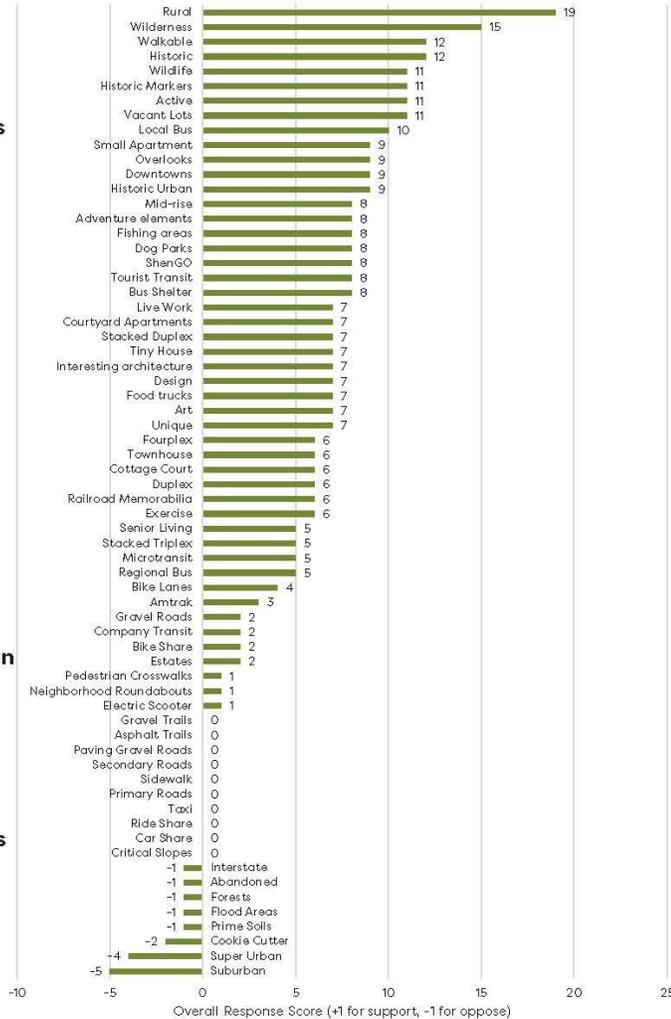
Preference Survey

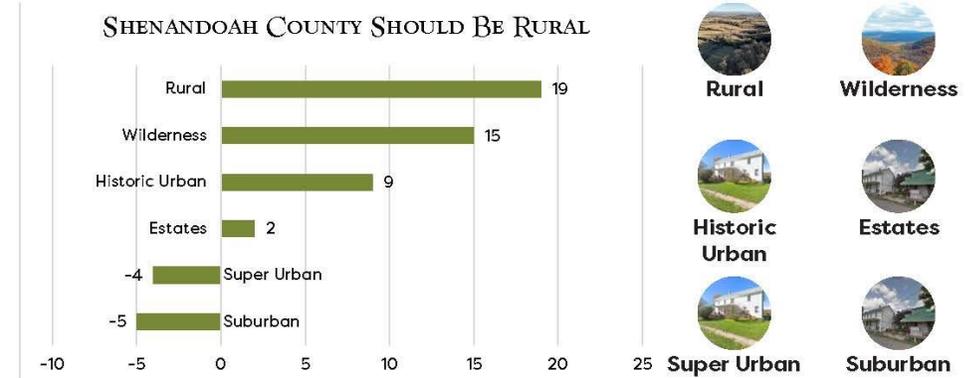
Top Five Supported Identity Aspects / Ideas



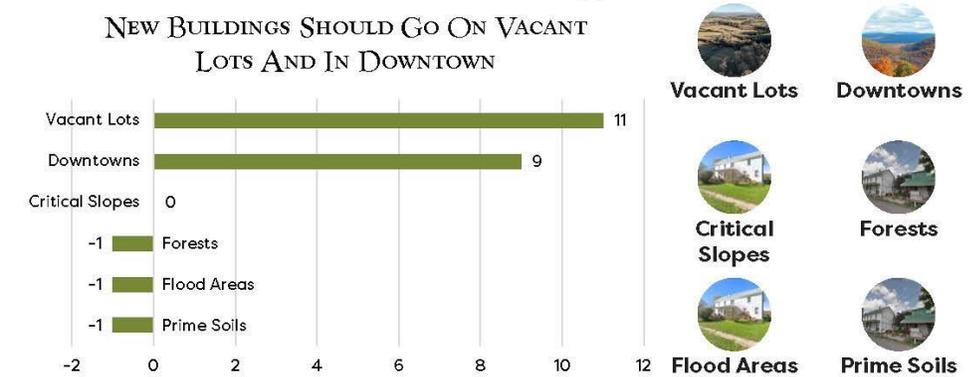

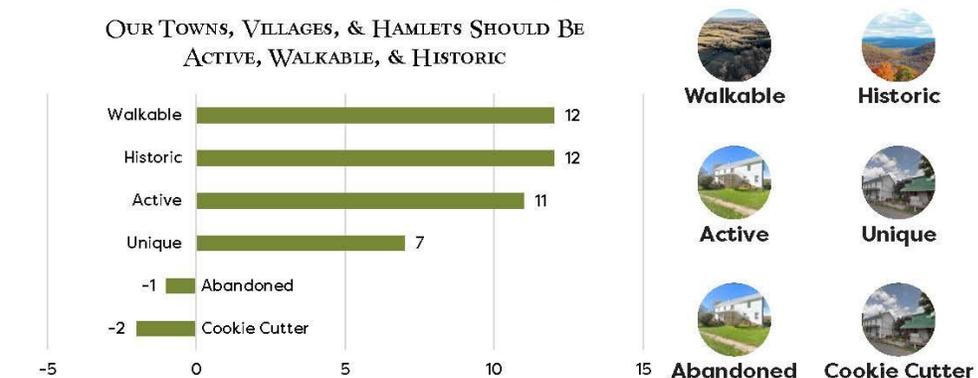

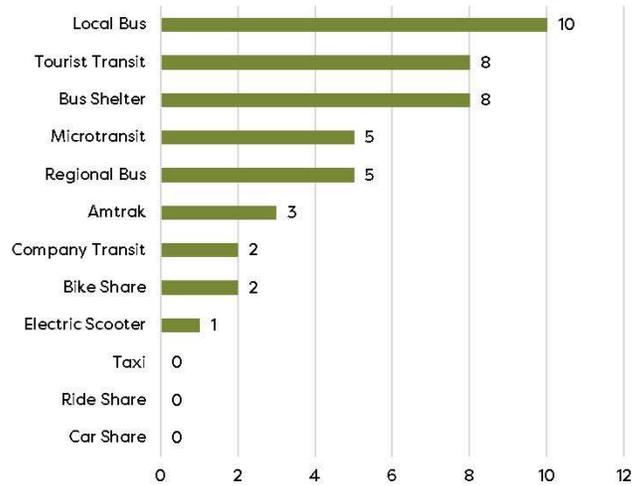

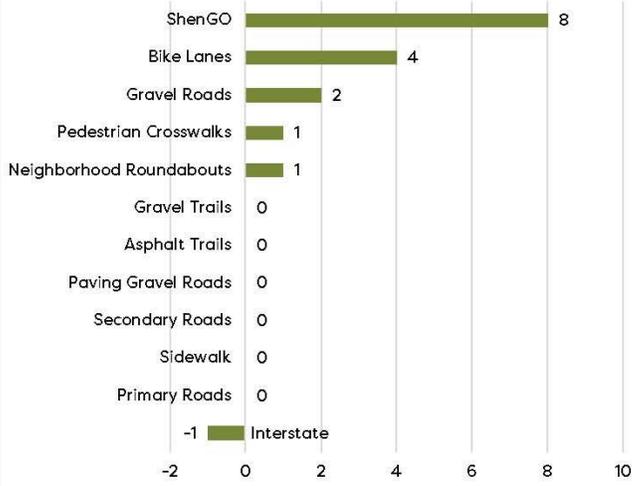

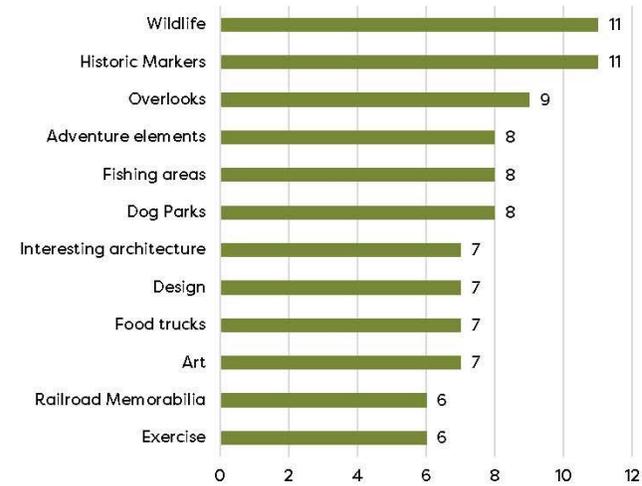

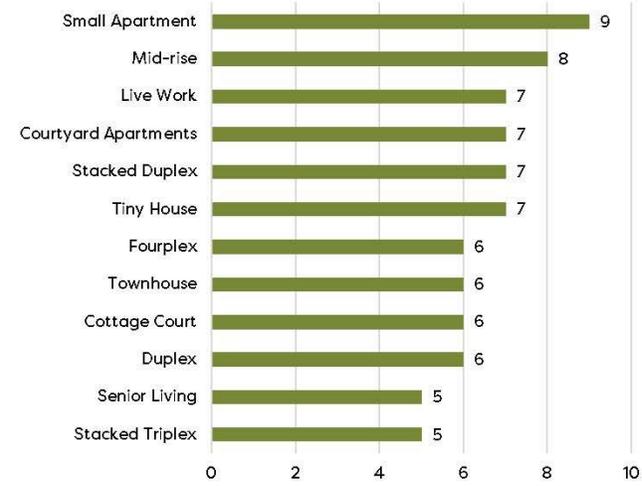

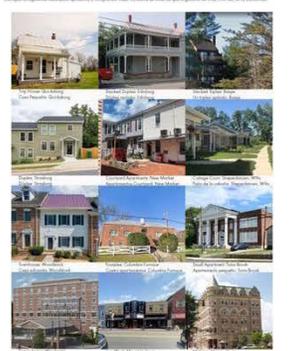

RESPONDENTS PREFER DENSE SMALL APARTMENTS AND MIXED USE OPTIONS



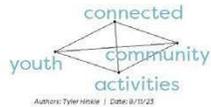

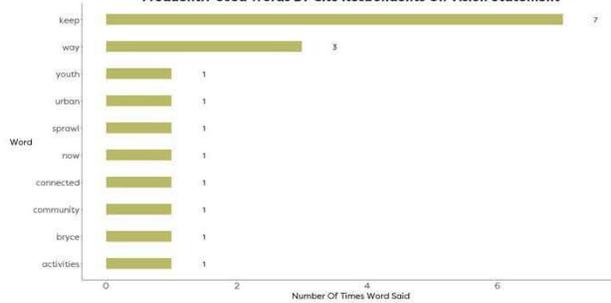

FUTURE LAND USE MAP

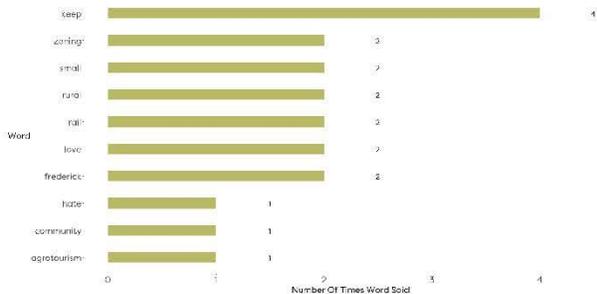

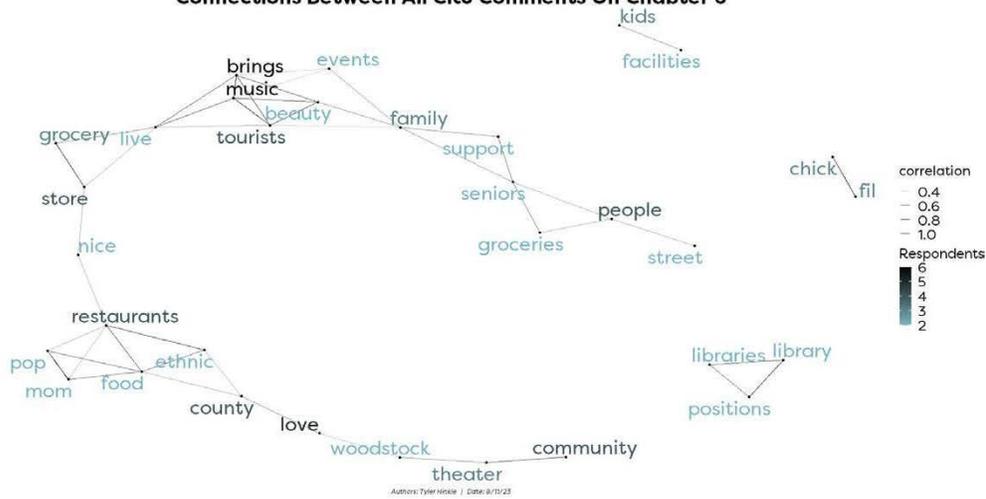
Increase low income housing

Objective 5.4.6 Establish a Housing Trust Fund. Create a pool of dedicated funds from a portion of the County's lodging tax proceeds, proffers from developers and tax exempt bonds that could be used to support efforts to provide affordable housing. Objective 5.4.7 Incentive Programs Provide tax incentives to landlords who rent at or below HUD-established fair market value (or below market value). Is there a way to provide incentives to developers to include affordable housing in by-right developments (density bonus? Use of tax exempt bonds?) Somewhere, address allowing accessory dwelling units in all zoning districts (if not already allowed). These could include apartments within single family homes, above garages or in suitable outbuildings or tiny homes. Ensure that all rental units comply with requirements of applicable building and housing codes affecting health and safety. All rentals shall meet minimum safety and sanitary conditions. and tenant rights to fit and habitable rental units (as per Virginia Statement of Tenant Rights) Through rezonings and SUPs, ensure a mixture of housing types is provided that support all income levels of County residents.

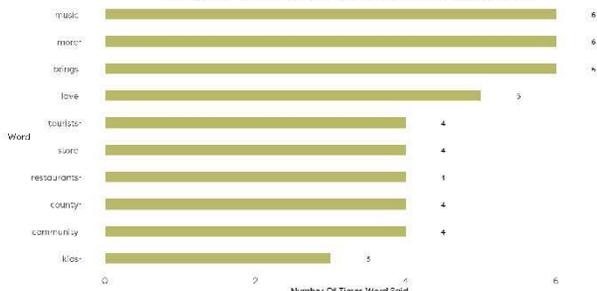
Add objectives: Identify barriers to affordable housing. Establish Housing Advisory Council, consisting of representatives of County, towns, DSS, fire marshal, realtors, landlords, developers and non-profits to develop recommendations for affordable housing and public policy.

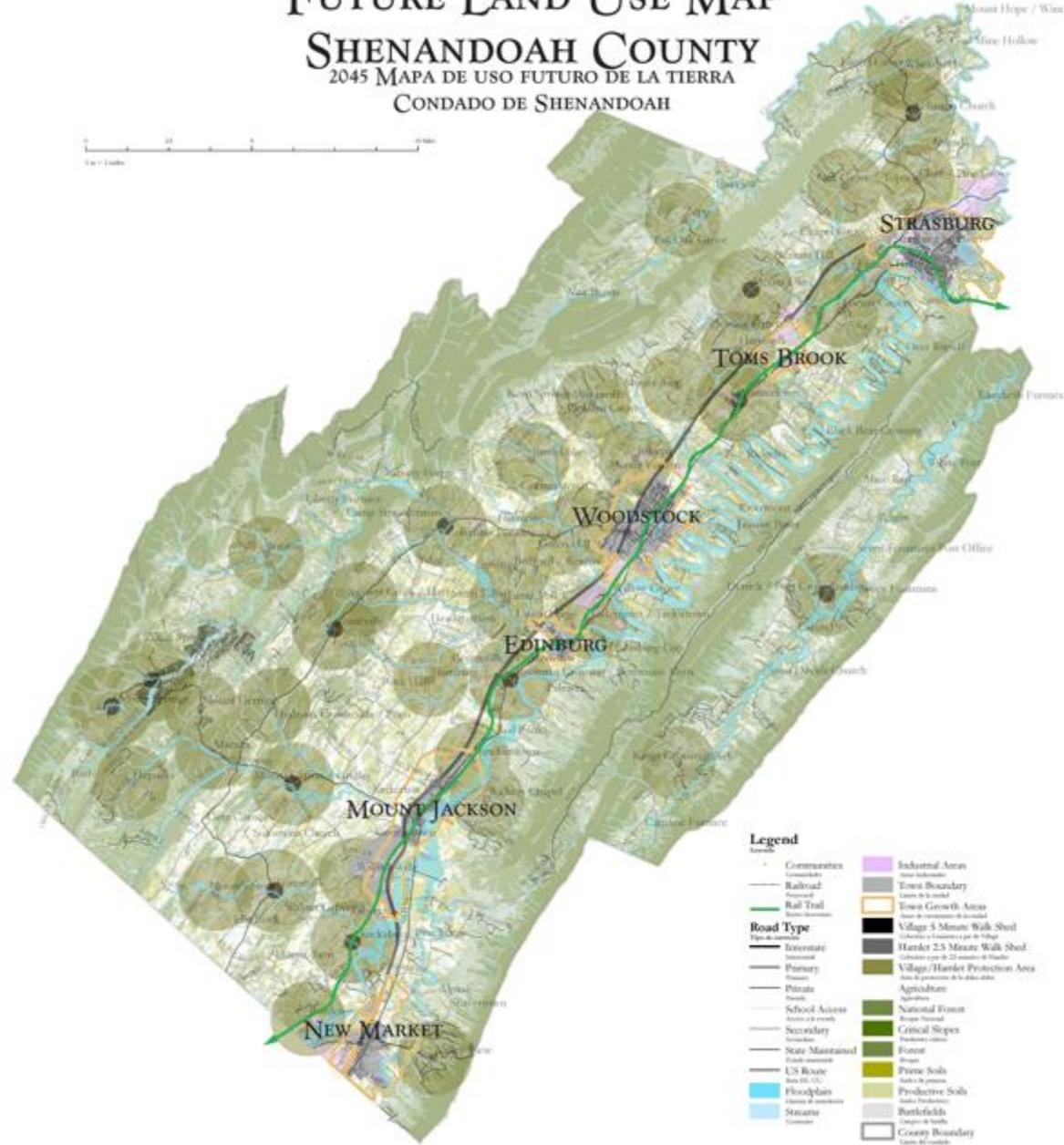

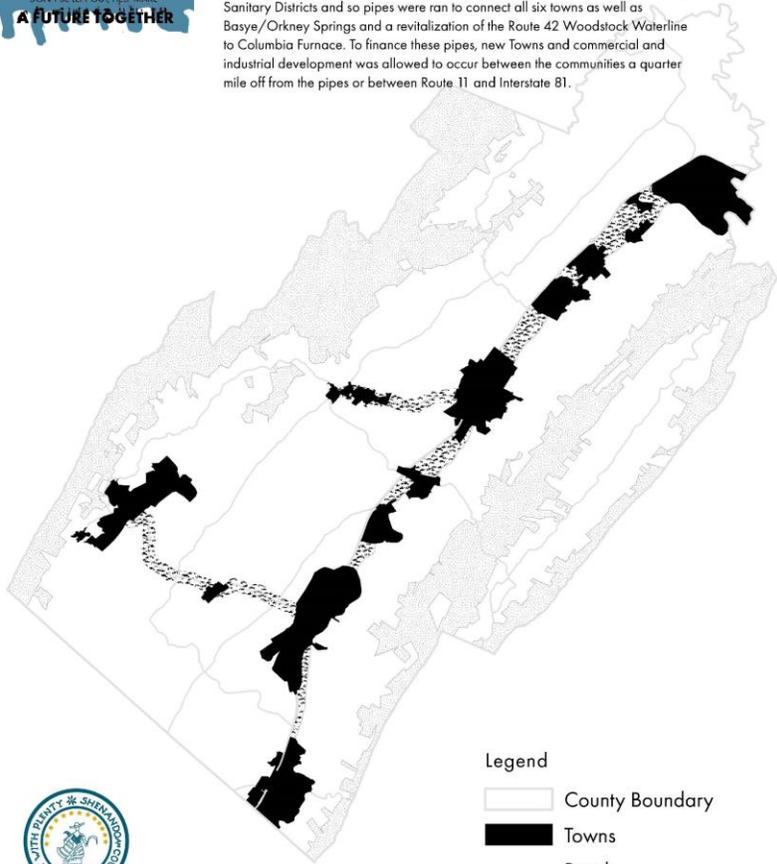

Regional Water Concept

This map was created by mapping the concern proposed by the Economic Development Council of the Shenandoah County Chamber of Commerce in 2023 where they suggested that it would be more economically feasible for all water and sewer services to be operated under one entity with connected pipes. In this future all Town water and sewer services failed as well as the County Sanitary Districts and so pipes were ran to connect all six towns as well as Basye/Orkney Springs and a revitalization of the Route 42 Woodstock Waterline to Columbia Furnace. To finance these pipes, new Towns and commercial and industrial development was allowed to occur between the communities a quarter mile off from the pipes or between Route 11 and Interstate 81.

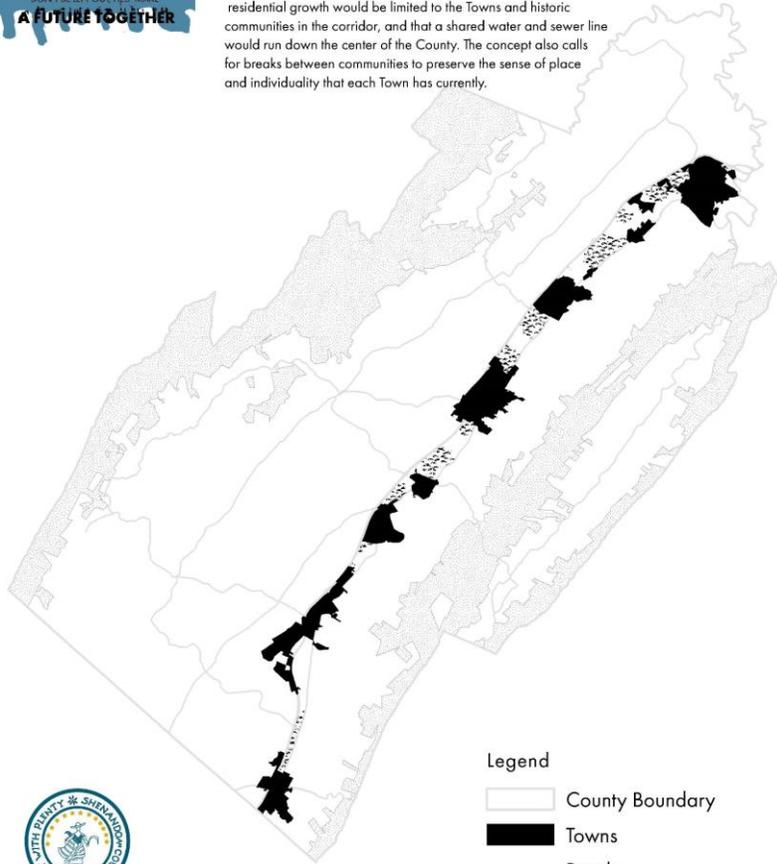

This map was created by mapping the concept presented by the Economic Development Council of the Shenandoah County Chamber of Commerce in 2023 where they suggested that all of the land between U.S. Route 11 and Interstate 81 should be open for new commercial and industrial development while all future residential growth would be limited to the Towns and historic communities in the corridor, and that a shared water and sewer line would run down the center of the County. The concept also calls for breaks between communities to preserve the sense of place and individuality that each Town has currently.

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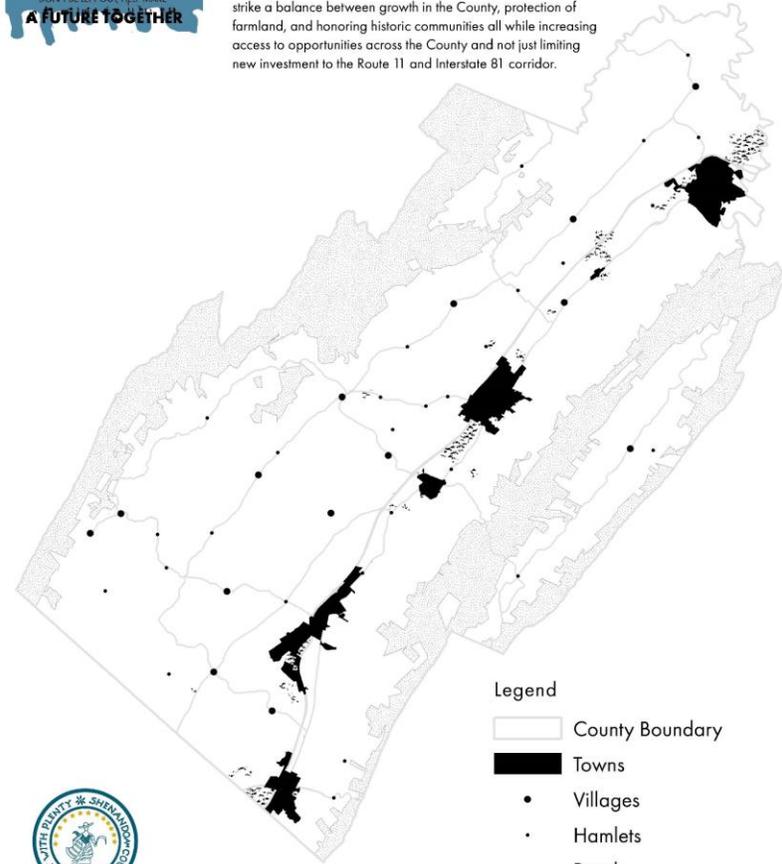
