PURPOSE OF THE PLAN

A Comprehensive Plan is the overarching road-map to describe where a community plans to go for the next 20 years. All municipal governments must develop a comprehensive plan every 20 years in order to be in accordance with VA § 15.2-2223. In addition to developing new comprehensive plans every 20 years, municipal governments must update their comprehensive plans every five years, with more comprehensive updates at the ten year mark.

The State of Virginia lists that the purpose of a comprehensive plan is to improve the public health, safety, convenience, and welfare, and to plan for the future development of communities so that:

- New community centers be developed with adequate highway, utility, health, educational, and recreational facilities.
- The need for mineral resources and the needs of agriculture, industry, and business be recognized in future growth.
- The concerns of military installations be recognized.
- Residential areas be provided with healthy surroundings for family life.
- Agricultural and forestal land be preserved.
- Growth of the community be consonant with the efficient and economical use of public funds.

VISION OF 2025

In the year 2025, Shenandoah County will be a primarily rural community that:

- Protects its natural resources;
- Directs its growth to the towns, ensuring its open agricultural character;
- Provides a variety of jobs in business, light industry, tourism and sustainable agriculture;
- Maintains moderate growth of a demographically varied population
- Supports safe and efficient interstate transportation and maintains the rural character of its primary and secondary roads;
- Affords its students excellent and appropriate education;
- Serves its citizens with public facilities and services that enhance their quality of life;
- Ensures preservation of its natural beauty and unique, historic character by strictly adhering to the goals of the Comprehensive Plan

SUMMARY UPDATES

Agricultural and Forestal Districts: No Actions.

Conservation Easement Authority: Received up to \$25,000/year and \$142,000 for a grant.

Economic Development: Increase of employment, average weekly wages, and new start ups.

Education: Increase in average SAT Scores and most students continue their education locally.

Housing: 184 housing units built, inventory decreased, and median sales price increased.

Population: Increased by 962, new Census Place, largest increase in Strasburg/Woodstock.

Transportation: VDOT investment increased, ShenGO served nearly 2,000 riders, crashes increased.

Planning Commission Actions: 19 public hearings with rentals as most common, Districts 2 & 5 busiest.

Review of Board Actions: All actions found to be in compliance with the Comprehensive Plan.

OTHER STATISTICS OF NOTE

The Citizen's Advisory Committee held a set of District Information Sessions to help better outline to the public not just what the Comprehensive Plan is, but also that there is a Comprehensive Plan and that it is important for them to become involved so the next plan is their plan as well. Below is a summary of the most common aspects participants like and want to see improved in the County:

Over the course of 2021, County Staff found the following statistics to be of note for the future of the County and the implications that the statistics provide:

- There is a potential for 45,891 new houses to be developed in Shenandoah County, including its six incorporated Towns:
 - 14,519 of the potential houses could take place on existing platted lots.
 - 31,372 of the potential houses would come from subdividing land to its full extent under the provisions of its local zoning.
 - 29,553 of the potential houses would take place outside of Town boundaries.
 - 2,998 of the potential houses outside Town Boundaries would be in a Sanitary District.

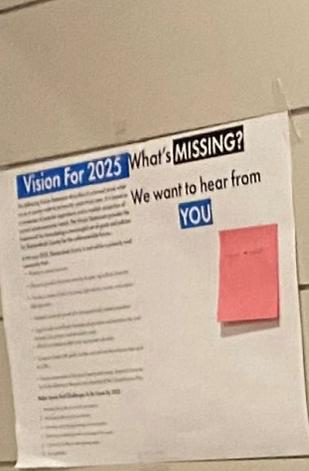
THE FUTURE

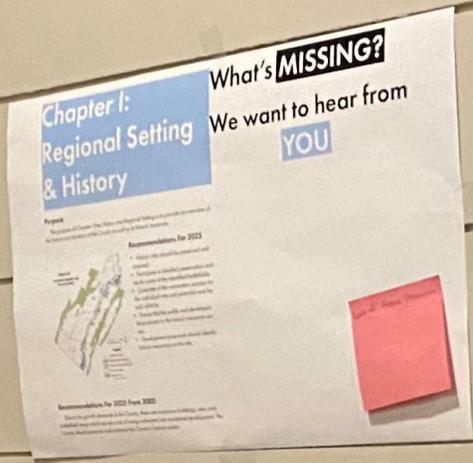
- Maps for citizens to show places they love and where they want improvement.

Once the CAC has completed its Community Collaboration Sessions in August, they will begin writing the next Comprehensive Plan for Shenandoah County this Fall.

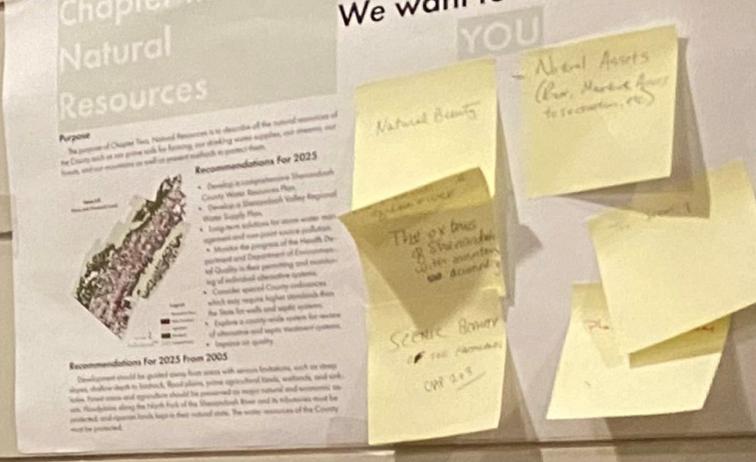
